had just a few hundred residents. Sutter built a fort, and soon he had 12,000 head of cattle and hundreds

By the mid-1840s, more and more Americans were trickling into California by wagon and ship. Sutter welcomed the newcomers: he saw them as subjects for his new kingdom. (77) \_\_\_\_\_\_.

At the beginning of 1848, Sutter sent James Marshall and about twenty men to the American River to build a sawmill. It was nearly complete when a glint of something caught Marshall's eye. Later he wrote: "I reached my hand down and picked it u; it made my heart thump, for I was certain it was gold. The piece was about half the size and shape of a pea. Then I saw another."
